Benchmark	All students met the 2012 Performance AMO target of 72.89%; TAGG students met the 2012 Performance AMO of 68.27%. All students met the Three Year Performance AMO and TAGG students missed their Three Year Performance AMO by 0.7%. It is expected that the TAGG and non-TAGG students and each sub-population group will meet or exceed the 2013 and 2014 AMO.
