REGULAR MEETING
April 17, 2012

I Call to Order

Mayor Dennis Behling called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

II Responding to the roll call were Bea Crites, Joe Gies, Bill Svehla, Chuck Birmes, and Ken Fortier. No replacement at this time for Ward 3, Position 2.

- A. A minute of silence was observed in memory of Kathy Travis, who passed away 4/2/12 and the City's former mayor, Lloyd Travis, who passed away 4/4/12.

III APPROVAL –

March Council Meeting Minutes

- A. Ald. Fortier moved to accept minutes as presented.

- A. Mayor Behling stated that the March report was being presented and asked if there were any questions concerning the report, none asked. The Mayor stated that report would be available to the public.

- A. Mayor Behling stated that the report for 3/12 to 4/6/12 was being presented and asked if there were any questions concerning the report, none asked. The Mayor stated that report would be available to the public.

V. OLD BUSINESS:

- A. Appointment Alderman Ward 3, Position 2
1. Mayor Behling stated that he was unable to present to Council a name for consideration of appointment for the position at this time due to possible conflicts of scheduling on the part of candidate(s).
 - a. He will contact the Municipal League to follow up with the current situation. If a special meeting needs to be called, a contact will be made to that effect; if not this will be covered at the May Council Meeting.
- B. Ordinance 12-03 re: Fixed Assets-2nd Reading
1. Ald. Crites made a motion to suspend the rules and have the second reading by title only, Ald. Gies 2nd the motion, motion approved.
 2. Mayor Behling read the Ordinance by title only.
- C. Farmers Market
1. Mayor Behling stated that we needed help with the Farmers Market.
 - a. People are coming in to the office for permits, etc., but they are also coming in with complaints or things that want to do different and we don't have time to do all this. Perhaps an Ad Hoc committee would be in order, if there are any suggestions or know of anybody that is willing to serve on an Ad Hoc committee that would be willing to be at the Market on Friday and talk to the people and find out what they want, etc. Just contact the Mayor.
 1. When asked what some of the complaints might be, the Mayor responded that one of the items that they had wanted to do when we had the meeting with the

vendors was bring in guests (Woodcarver/Quilters/Art Club), but we don't have the time to find the people to fill this position.

2. At this time the Mayor turned this portion over to Mrs. Barton who has the most contact with the vendors.
 - a. She requested help in contacting people for the guest spots, distributing posters, and contacting possible advertisers.
 - b. Doug Stephens volunteered his help, Grace Haggart with (Aunt Grace's) volunteered to put information through her web site out to different contacts, and Bea Crites will contact Suddenlink for advertising on Channel 5.

VI. NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Mayor Behling presented to Council a verbal proposition to pay Roger Morgan a retainer of \$125.00 a month and have a formal appointment of Mr. Morgan as the City Attorney. He can find no documentation which appoints Mr. Morgan to that position and believes it may have been done by motion of the Council. Finding this record would be an insurmountable task.
 1. After discussion concerning current legal expenses and the fact that it was difficult to get a response out of Mr. Morgan due to his schedule, it was decided that a draft would be presented to Council at the next meeting.
- B. Mayor Behling had received an e-mail from our former Ald. Della Scott concerning her current location in Tripoli, Libya and read it aloud for Council and the audience to share
- C. Mayor Behling stated he had received a formal request at 11:45 AM 4/17/12 from Buck Neubauer and Christi Wood concerning an appeal to extend the hours of operation of the proposed sports bar from closing on week day evenings from 8 to 10 and on week-end evenings from 10 to 12.
 1. Because the minutes from the Planning and Zoning Special Meeting have not been approved by Sherman Fine at this time, they cannot be presented to Council at this meeting, but will be at the May meeting.
 - a. This appeal may require a public hearing, which Mayor Behling will verify with Municipal League's legal department.
