Bruno-Pyatt used state grant for growth on the Aspire and worked with organizations such as Marion County Auxiliary, Pyatt Baptist Church, Bruno Baptist Church, Harp's Grocery, Flippin Wal-Mart and our PTO to provide backpacks and school supplies to all students.

Bruno-Pyatt will work with County Extension Agent, Emilee Moody to provide SNAP-Ed programs, such as, Crockpot Cooking for parents and community members. Arvest Bank has helped by providing funding for this event.

The Parent Facilitator and classroom teachers are coordinating with area banks and insurance companies to provide books/supplies for family literacy kits to be passed out at our parent literacy workshop. Each kit will include 2 books, reading tips, activities and supplies to complete the activities. School staff will assist parents in

helping their child with reading.

The school counselor works with area and regional colleges attending college days and college tours.

Our students are given the opportunity to participate in Talent Search which is provided through North Arkansas Community and Technical College. The Talent Search program identifies and assists individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds who have the potential to succeed in higher education. The program provides academic, career, and financial counseling to its participants and encourages them to graduate from high school and continue on to and complete their postsecondary education. The program publicizes the availability of financial aid and assist participant with the postsecondary application process.

Youth Leadership is a coordination of services between Marion County Schools, the Marion County Extension Office and Southshore to instill leadership skills in our schools.

The Bruno-Pyatt Elementary Student Council and Youth Leadership Team coordinate with community members and local businesses to provide Christmas Food Boxes to families in need.

BrunoPyatt School will provide instruction parents on how to incorporate developmentally appropriate learning activities in the home environment during family literacy events, which may include:

- o Make and take nights
- o Literacy workshops Staff will work with parents and provide tips for sharing fiction and nonfiction books. Parents will receive 2 books (1 fiction/1 nonfiction) and a parent information sheet, instructions about how to use the packet, Creativity Activity: a handson craft project Imagination Activity: encourages imaginative play, writing, or drawing and a Get Real Activity: focuses on realworld experiences for parent and child. A Parent survey will also be included.

The school will work with Head Start and area colleges to help provide a smooth transition from one level to the next. OUR Head Start regularly comes to the school for breakfast, lunch, and attend special programs when appropriate. We try to ease the transition from High School to College by attending college days at local colleges, hosting college/trade school reps, military recruiters and by hosting financial aid workshops. During interventions, Seniors work on life skills such as: Career Research and personal finance planning. We attempt to keep parents informed of procedures and related activities by posting events/activities to the school webpage, social media. the school sign and by sending messages.

Informational messages are sent to parents via Facebook, Remind, and a weekly phone call to parents.
