- <u>K-8 Essential Curriculum</u> replaces the former "Refrigerator Curriculum" and indicates essential learning targets expected by the end of each grade level. Essential curriculum is provided for Social Studies, Mathematics, Literacy and Science. (Dr. Pride shared that this link is for parents/guardians who want to help their child at home. This is not a list for schools to utilize as we have the discretion to identify essential standards within our district.)

<u>Building List of Resources for Comprehension, Fluency, and Vocabulary</u> Each building will have a representative that will share about resources being utilized. No cohesive program seems to be available.
Kindergarten - does not want more curriculum materials
NWH - would like to purchase additional materials to cover all literacy areas
HIS - would like to purchase additional materials
PMS completed PLC planning with JH - do not feel that they have enough curricular materials for their students
JH - discussed programs they are using and areas of weaknesses they are seeing.
Discussed the uses of Kami for integration into Canvas.
School Board gave funds \$10,000 for Imagination library program.
HS - no report
Parent report - she cannot identify any discernible curriculum. Also reported that elementary level parents and students have a lot of difficulty using Kami.

NWEA now linked with Newsela <u>Partnership</u>. **NWEA partnered with Newsela so NWEA automatically assigns material based on their MAP scores and needs**.

<u>Lexia Core 3-5</u> Program Considerations: For Phonics, there is limited content for decoding. In Vocabulary, face-to-face, teacher-led lessons have an oral language support, but

oral language support is limited in the online program. Additionally, there is no content for comprehension monitoring with the online software.
