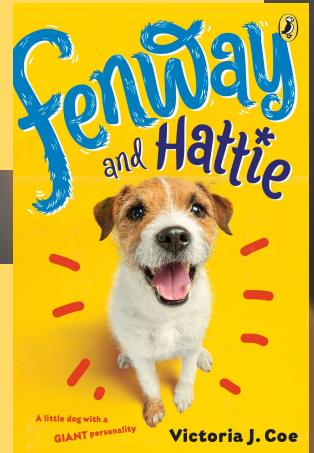
Over the Thanksgiving break there are two things MHK students can work on. Learning to zip their coat independently and tie their shoes. Here are some video links that might help.
