INTRODUCTION

Thank you for your interest in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's 1994 Tribal Scholars Program. The USDA 1994 Tribal Scholars Program was established to strengthen the long-term partnership between USDA and the 1994 Land-Grant Institutions by increasing the number of students studying, graduating, and pursuing careers in in food, agriculture, natural resources, and other related fields of study.

The USDA 1994 Tribal Scholars Program is implemented under the USDA Fellows Experience Program (FEP). Successful applicants will receive a temporary appointment to the USDA, not to exceed 4 years. Upon successful completion of the degree requirements and the end of the agreement period, the scholar is eligible for conversion to permanent appointment in service to USDA without further competition.

The USDA 1994 National Scholar is required to:

- ✓ Be a U.S citizen
- ✓ Have applied to one of the 1994 Land-Grant Tribal College or Universities.
- ✓ Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale.
- ✓ Have demonstrated leadership and community service.
- ✓ Have submitted an official transcript with a school seal and/or the signature of an authorized school official.
- ✓ Submit an essay that is 500-800 words describing 1) What motivates you to consider a career in public service working for the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Include information about your educational and career goals and how this scholarship may assist you to achieve them; 2) How did you became interested in studying food, agriculture, and natural resource sciences or another related discipline in college.

The second recommendation can be from (as an example) a current or previous school counselor, teacher, principal, tribal college and university president, or employer. Make sure the recommendation is from someone who knows you well and can comment on your abilities.
