Intro to Computer Science:

Using various resources, we will give a broad overview of what computer science is and how it is involved in our everyday lives. We will discuss basic concepts, such as, coding, algorithms, binary, robotics, space travel and more. The students will learn that computer science is not just people in lab coats or computer nerds. Computer science is now in healthcare, automotive, agriculture and many other industries.

3D design and production:

Using the PrintLab curriculum, we will teach the students to design their own 3D models using Tinkercad. They will then bring the design to life using 3D printers. Students will design basic shapes and models to gain a better understanding of the design process and software. They will then be given a project or problem to solve using what they have learned.
