Students will design basic shapes and models to gain a better understanding of the design process and software. They will then be given a project or problem to solve using what they have learned.

Using small spherical robots, students will understand the basic concepts of programming, problem solving and computational thinking. They will play STEAM-inspired games with the Sphero Play app and eventually advance to programming with Block Based Coding or Javascript in the Sphero Edu
